### ECATTS Helps NAVFAC Far East Hit EMS Target

Naval Facilities Engineering Command (NAVFAC) Far East has completed the highly visible requirement of Environmental Management System (EMS) implementation more than a month ahead of schedule.

NAVFAC Far East achieved full compliance ahead of the Sept. 30 deadline at Yokosuka, Sasebo, Okinawa, Atsugi, Diego Garcia and Chinhae. Nearly 3,000 employees at the six installations completed EMS awareness training using ECATTS this year.

"It has exponentially increased employee awareness of how their duties affect the environment, and

how to complete the mission in an environmentally-friendly manner, which will ultimately save the Navy countless time, energy, and money in the future through proactive environmental management and coordination," said Michael Corry, who was the command's compliance program manager during EMS implementation.

Corry added that implementation of EMS at NAVFAC Far East has resulted in numerous benefits to the organization, such as streamlined training records documentation, environmental management plans, standard operating procedures, and guidance.

Naval Facilities Engineering Command (NAVFAC) recently awarded a five year contract for the deployment and maintenance of the Environmental Compliance Assessment, Training, and Tracking System (ECATTS) for Navy bases and locations worldwide. The system will include many new domestic and new foreign sites translated into native languages. Customized ECATTS training will be completed by base-related personnel and construction contractors to assist with the Navy's responsibility for ensuring compliance with federal, state, and local environmental policies, regulations, and requirements.
